1 Study Documents A and B.

- (a) The author of Document A refers to migration in Australia.

- (b) The author of Document B refers to changes in working-age population.

Identify **three** different approaches to the issue of shrinking working-age population as given by the author of Document B. [3]

2 Study Document A.

Assess the strengths and weaknesses of the evidence used by the author of Document A to support their argument about demographic change.

3 Study Documents A and B.
