1 Study Documents A and B.

- (a) The author of Document A argues that scientists must engage in climate activism.

Identify **two** scientists who have commented on the role of scientists in climate activism, as given by the author of Document A. [2]

- (b) The author of Document B presents different views about climate activism.

Identify **three** newspapers which have published articles criticising climate activism, as given by the author of Document B. [3]

2 Study Document A.

Assess the strengths and weaknesses of the evidence used by the author of Document A to support the argument that climate scientists need to engage in civil disobedience to save the planet from climate change.

In your answer, include the impact of the evidence on the author's argument. [15]

3 Study Documents A and B.

The authors of both documents present different arguments and perspectives on climate activism.

Evaluate the arguments of the authors of both documents. In your answer, consider their perspectives and include a reasoned judgement about whether one argument is stronger than the other. [25]

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
