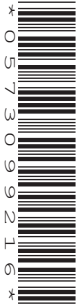

Section A: European history in the interwar years, 1919–41

- 1 Analyse the effectiveness of Mussolini's policies on women and young people. [30]
- 2 Assess the reasons for Stalin's policy of 'building socialism in one country'. [30]
- 3 Analyse the reasons for the Nazi persecution of Jews and other minorities. [30]
- 4 'The National Governments had more successes than failures between 1931 and 1939.' Discuss. [30]

Section B: The USA, 1944–92

- 5 'Eisenhower's election victories are best explained by economic prosperity.' Discuss this view. [30]
- 6 Assess how far there was greater acceptance of gay rights in the 1960s and 1970s. [30]
- 7 Evaluate the consequences of ongoing budget deficits in the 1980s and early 1990s. [30]
- 8 'Opposition to communist ideology was the main reason for US involvement in the Korean War.' Discuss this view. [30]

Section C: International history, 1945–92

- 9** 'Gorbachev's commitment to peaceful change was the main reason for the end of the Cold War.' Discuss. [30]
- 10** Discuss the extent to which North Korea was responsible for the outbreak of war in 1950. [30]
- 11** Assess how far African nations were able to adopt non-alignment during the Cold War. [30]
- 12** 'US policies had limited impact on the Middle East during the Cold War.' Evaluate this view. [30]

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
