Task 1

Open **Scene1.png** in a graphics application.



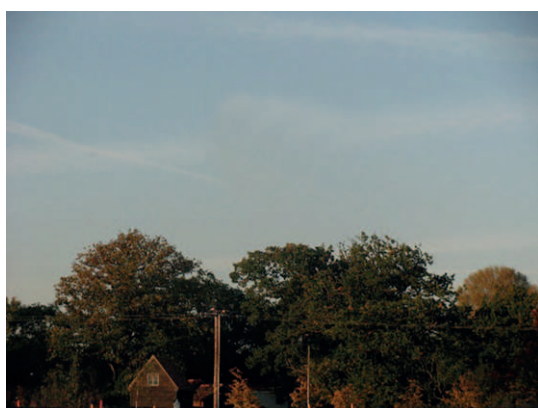
Extract a copy of only the balloon.

The size of the image of the balloon must be 3000 pixels wide by 2250 pixels high.

The balloon must have a transparent background.



Save the image as **Balloon1_** followed by your centre number_candidate number
e.g. Balloon1_ZZ999_9999



Repair the sky and save a copy of the scene without the balloon.

Save the image as **Scene2_** followed by your centre number_candidate number
e.g. Scene2_ZZ999_9999

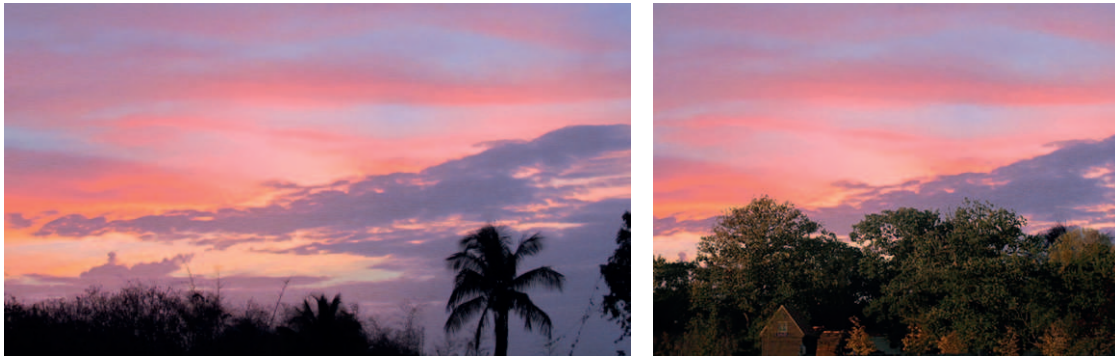
Without cropping, remove all traces of the posts, fence and wires that are shown in the *Scene2_* image.



Save the complete image as **Scene3_** followed by your centre number_candidate number
e.g. Scene3_ZZ999_9999

Open **Sunset.jpg** in a graphics application.

Replace all the sky in your *Scene3_* image with a suitable section of the sky shown in the *Sunset.jpg* image.



Save the image as **Scene4_** followed by your centre number_candidate number
e.g. Scene4_ZZ999_9999

Task 2

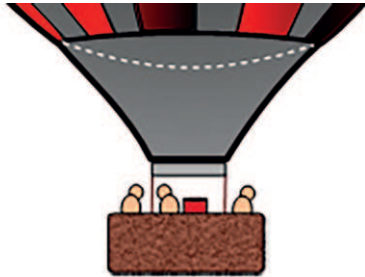
Create a vector graphic image of this balloon.

Use your *Balloon1_* image as a template for the proportions of the balloon and the size and positions of the panels.

Use gradient fills to create the impression of curves in the balloon, the panels and the text.

Make sure the proportions of the basket and the passengers match those shown in this image.

Make sure the basket has a pattern fill.



Save the image as a **scalable vector graphic** (.svg) as **Balloon2_** followed by your centre number_ candidate number
e.g. Balloon2_ZZ999_9999

Students at Tawara High School can be awarded Merits for good performance or Demerits for poor performance in these 5 categories:

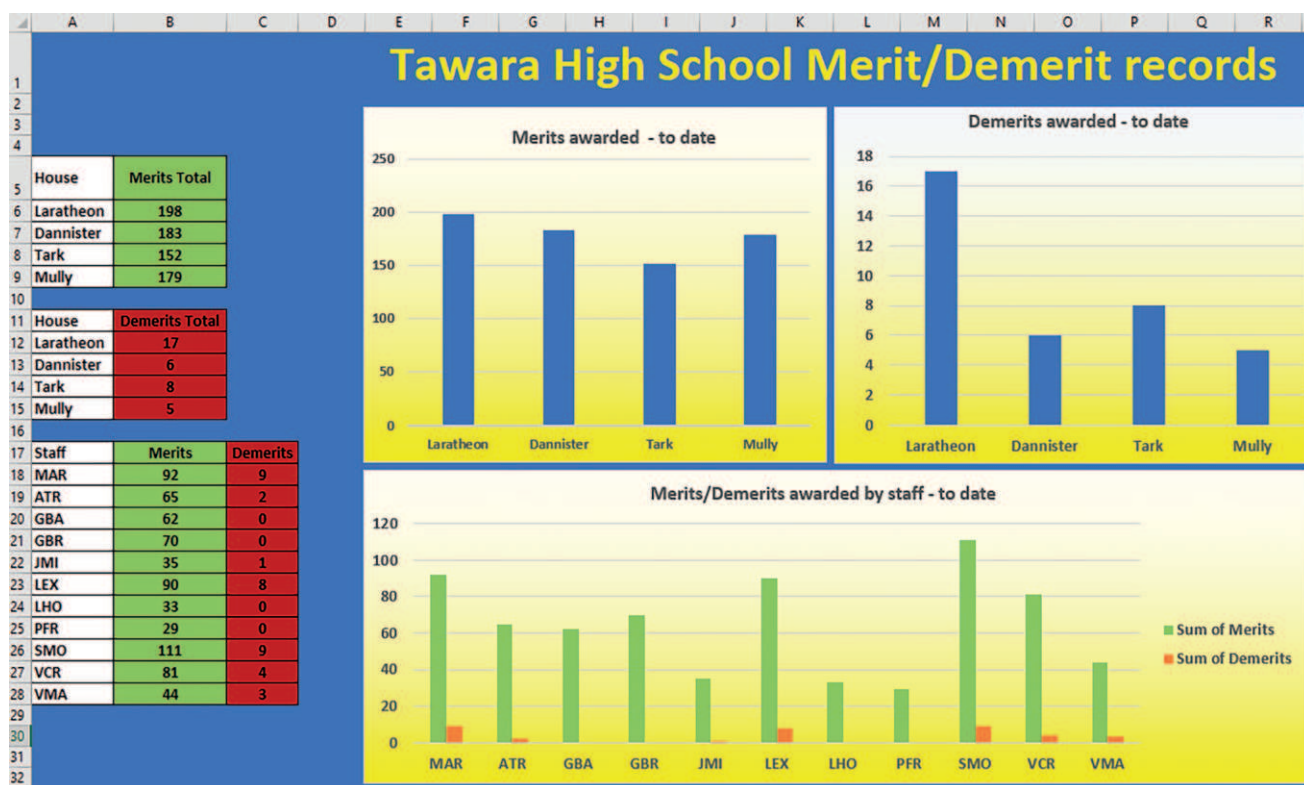
Academic

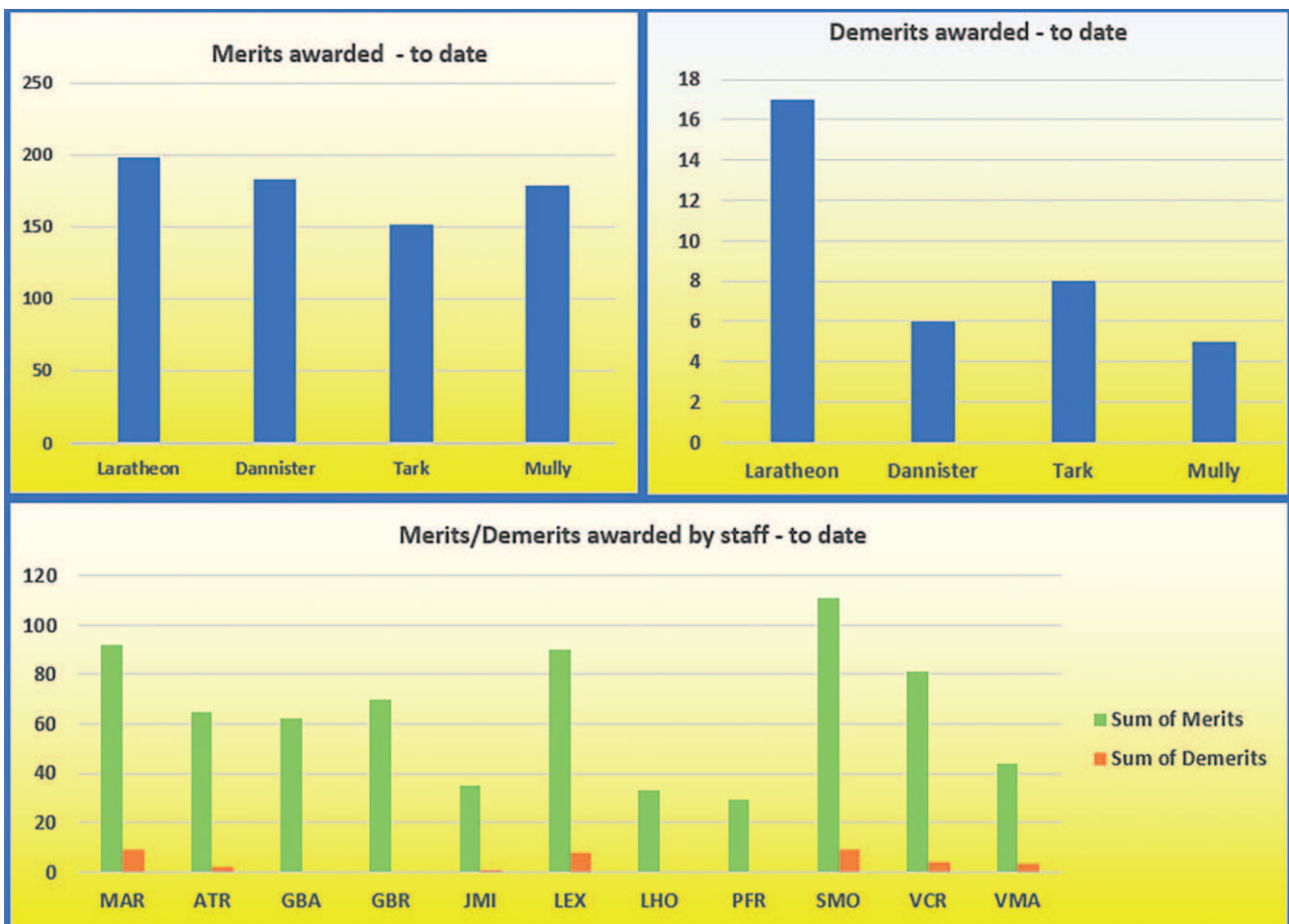

Set:

- all text as sans-serif
- all text as bold
- the dashboard heading to 36pt
- the chart headings to 14pt
- all other text to 12pt
- the dashboard background, table and chart columns to the colours shown
- each chart background with a yellow gradient fill.

Save the workbook as **JanFebMerits_** followed by your centre number_candidate number
e.g. JanFebMerits_ZZ999_9999

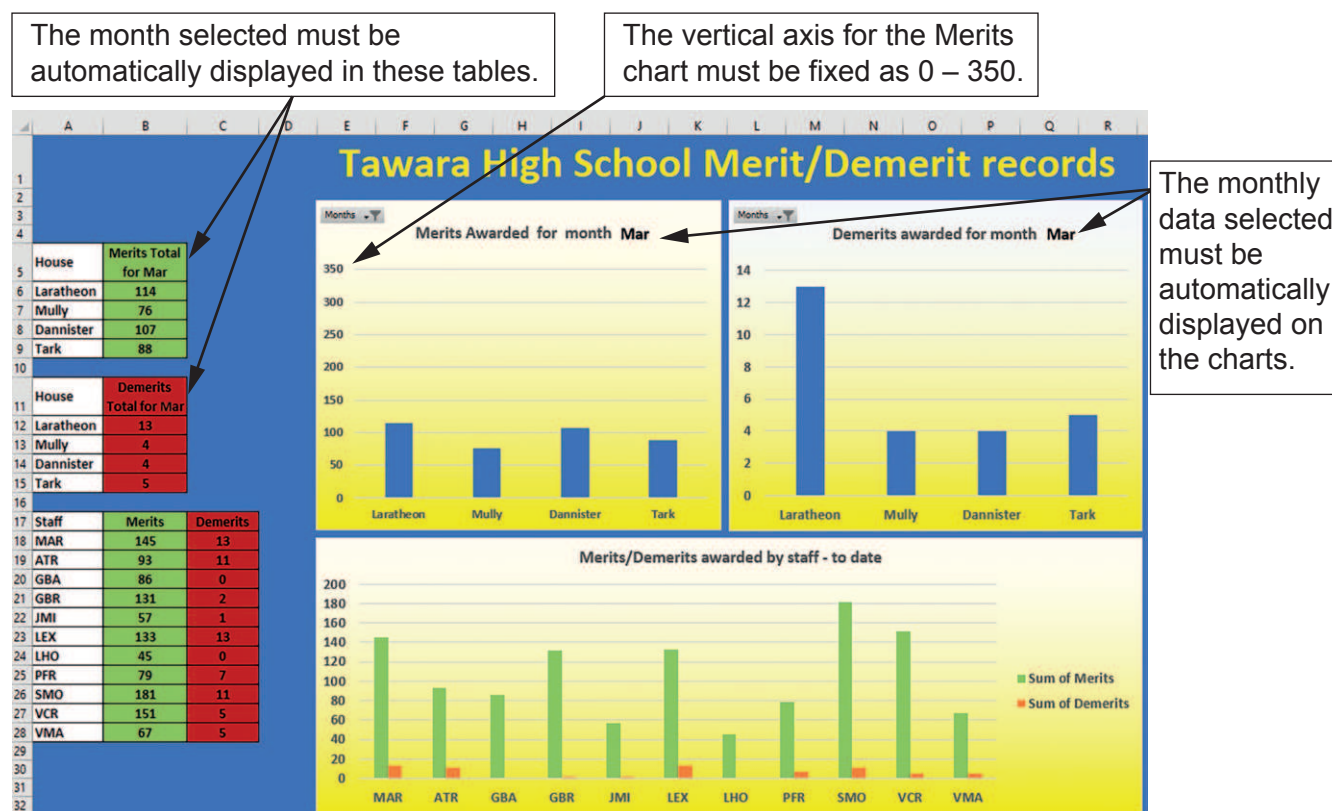
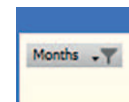
