



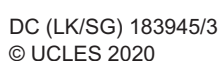

Global distribution of humid tropical and seasonally humid tropical environments

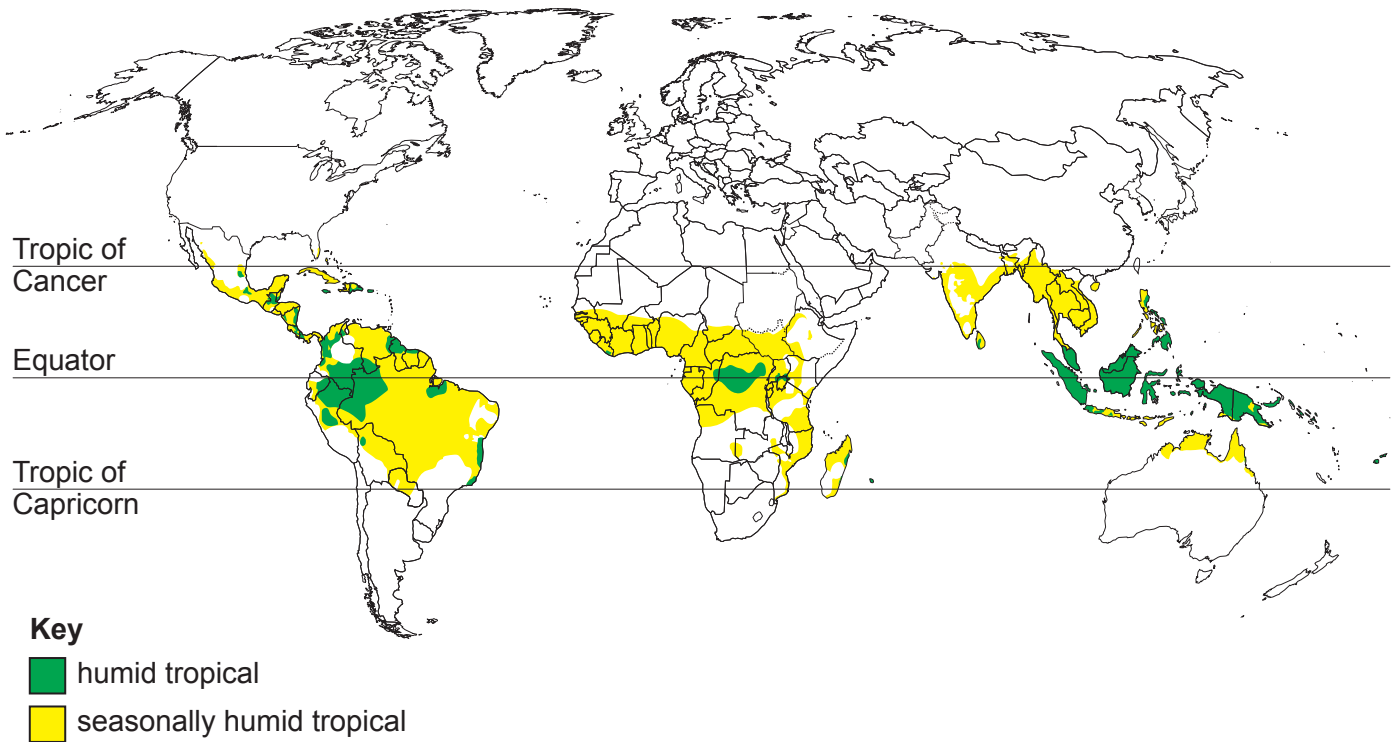

Relationship between wave height and fetch length for a coastal location

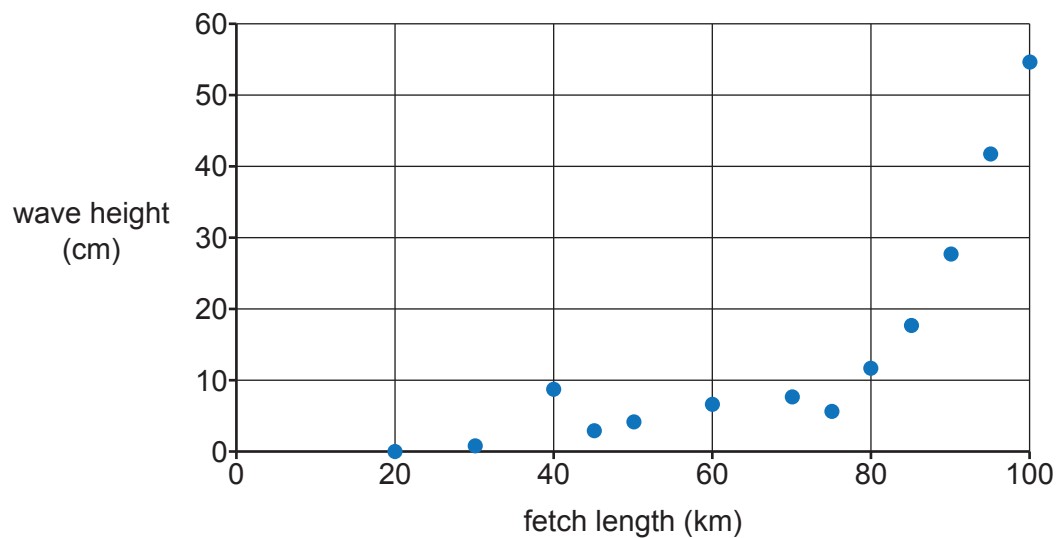

Volcanic hazard map for Dominica in the Caribbean Sea

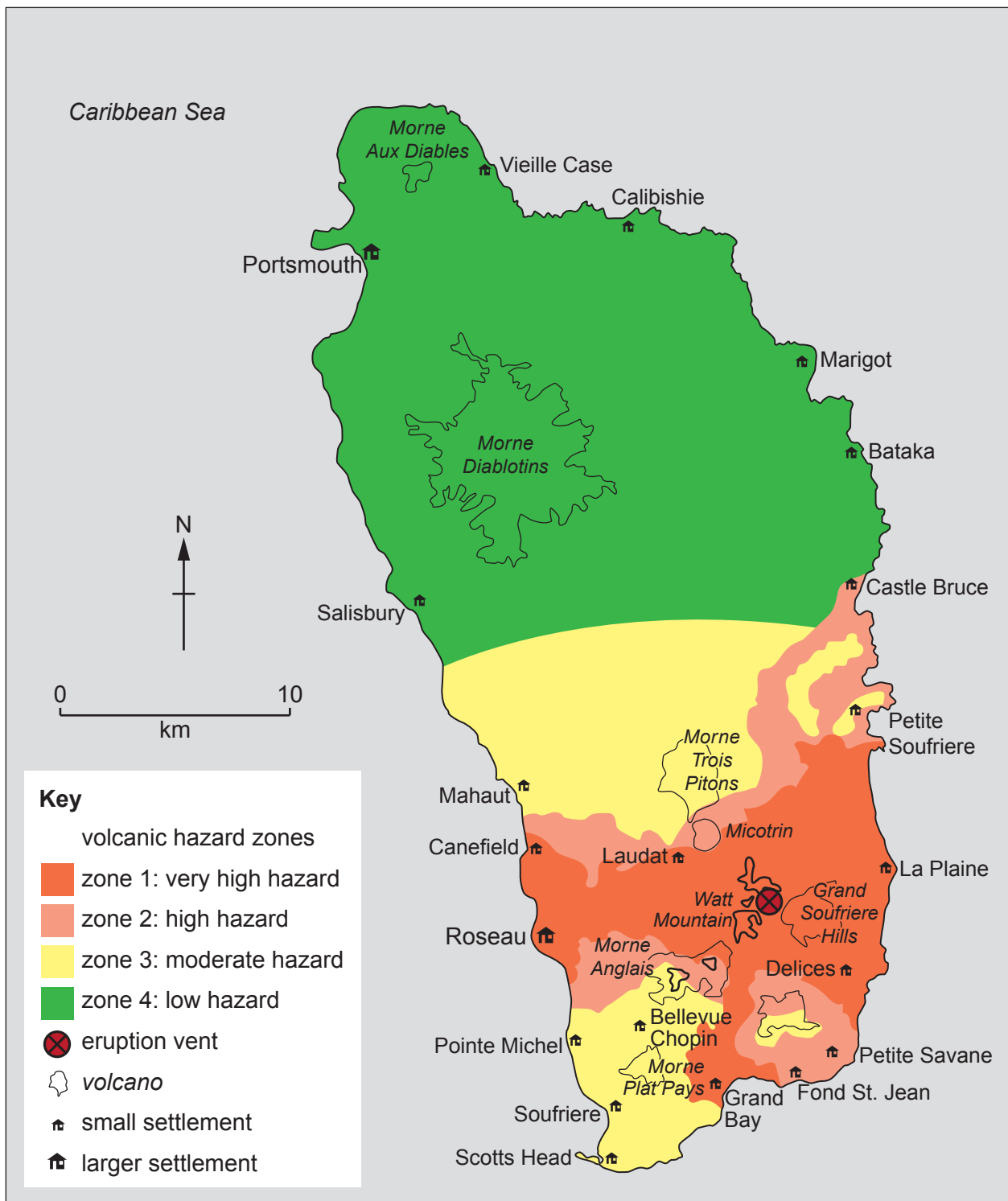
