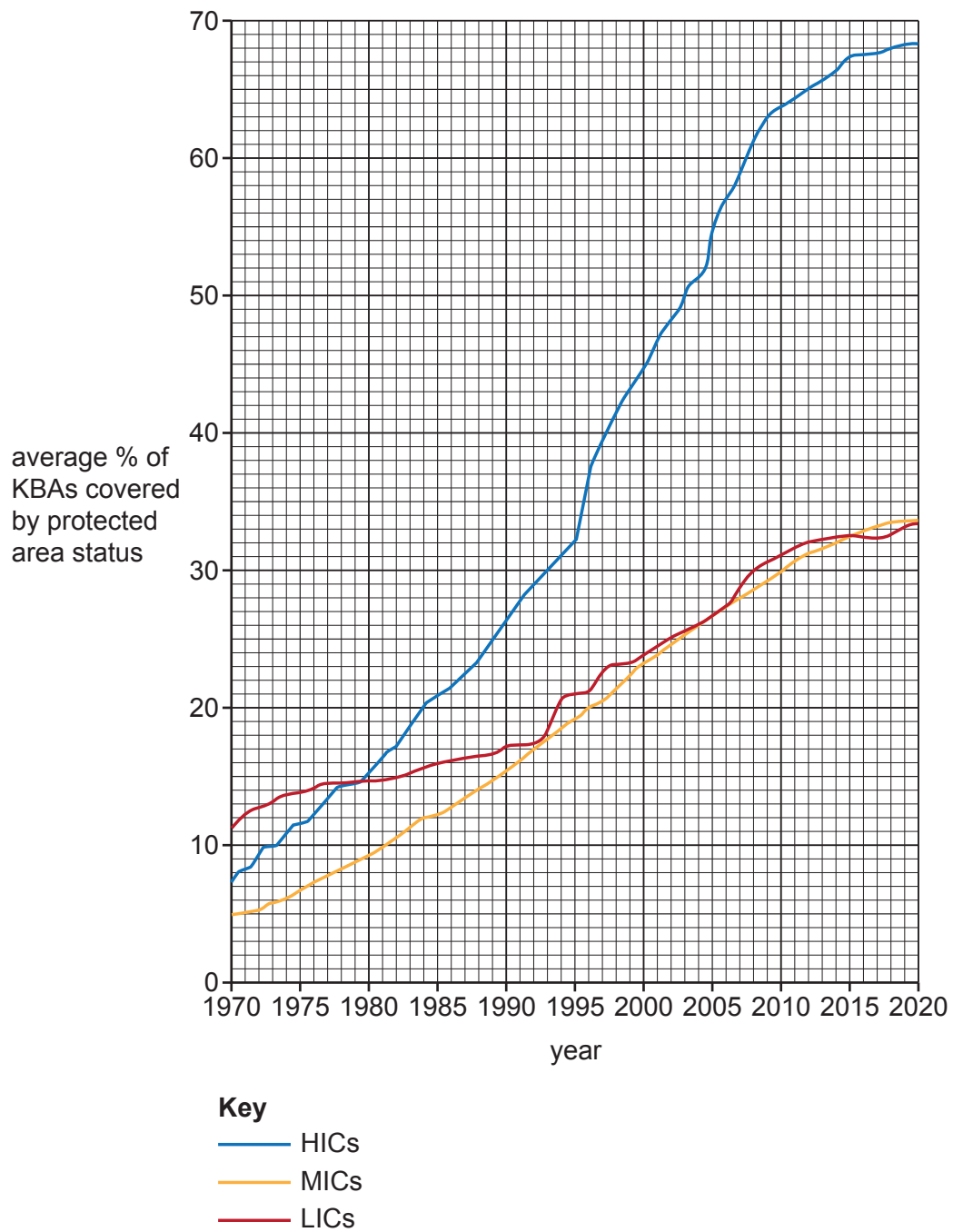

Number of Fairtrade farmers and workers, and total production of selected Fairtrade products, 2016

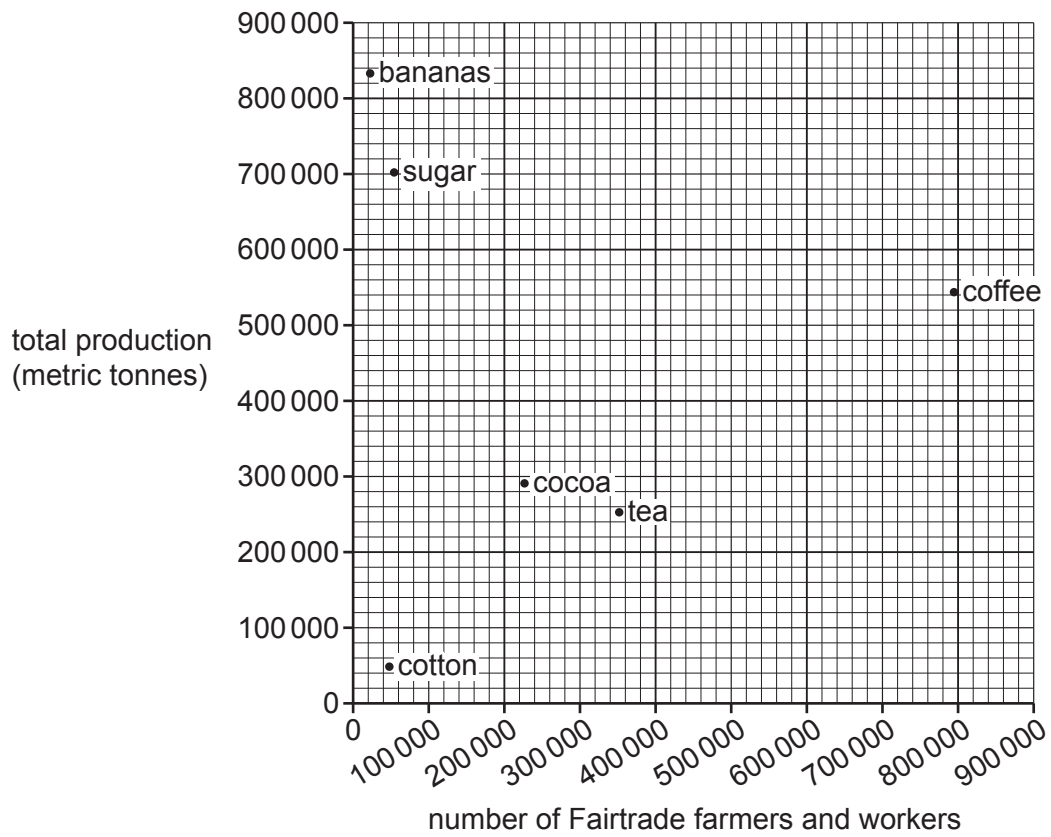
