between 1985 and 2020

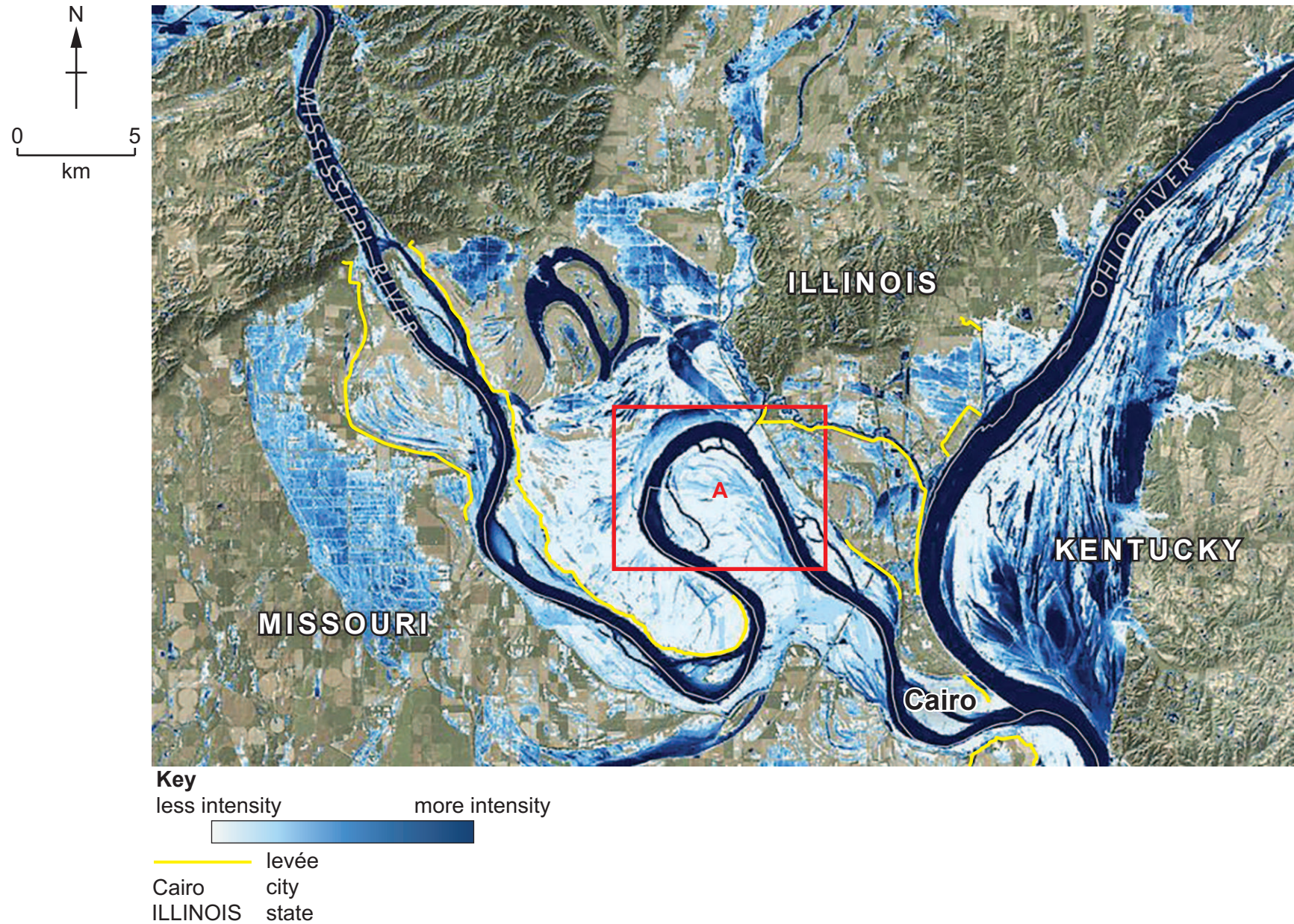

Seasonal changes in snow cover in North America, 1975–2020

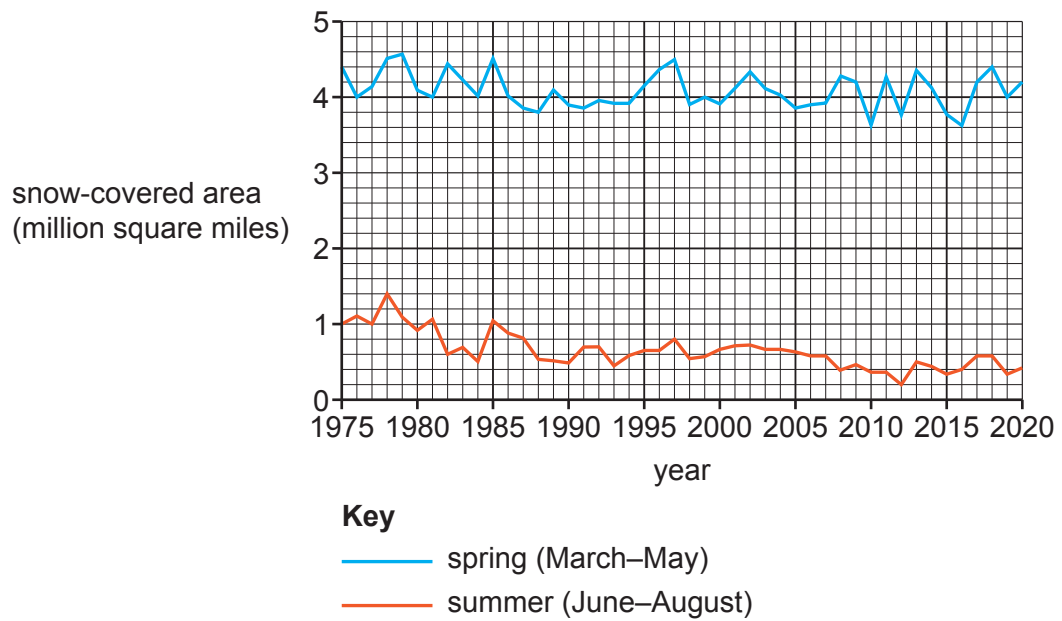
